



Woolly T-shirt



Size: UK 10/12-12/14 - USA 6/8-8/10 - EU 36/38-38/40 (UK 14/16-16/18 - USA 10/12-12/14 - EU 40/42-42/44) Note: figures in brackets () refer to larger sizes. Where only one figure is given this refers to all sizes. Skill Level: intermediate

How much yarn: 4 (5) balls of 50g (75m) of Anice yarn (35% Baby Alpaca, 35% Wool, 30% Cotton)

in light blue no. 9295

Needles: A pair of 7.50mm needles An additional 7.50mm needle Double-pointed (Dp) needle

Sewing needle: Yarn needle with rounded point **Other items:** 4 stitch-markers. 4 stitch-holders.

STITCHES

Using needle: K1, P1 rib.

STOCKING STITCH (st st): 1 row K (RS), 1 row P

CABLE STITCH: (work over 12 sts)

1st row: P2, K8, P2. **2nd and 4th rows:** K2, P8, K2. **3rd row:** P2, K8, P2. **5th row:** P2, 8 Left crossed stitches (= place next 4 sts onto Dp needle, on frontside, K next 4 sts, K4 from Dp needle). **6th row:** K2, P8, K2. Rep these 6 rows throughout.

TENSIONS

9.5 sts and 15 rows measure 10cm square over st st with 7.50mm needles. Cable, worked on 12 sts, measures approx 7.5cm in width.

Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

INSTRUCTIONS

Back: with 7.50mm needles cast on 43 (48) sts. For bor-

der, work 3 rows in K1, P1 rib (= 2,5cm). Then work in st st. When work measures 53,5 (59,5)cm from beg, i.e. 76 (86) rows from border, for shoulders leave on a stitch holder the first and the last 11 (12) sts. For neck, cast off centre 21 (24) sts purlways on RS of work.

Front: with 7.50mm needles cast on 43 (47) sts. For border, work 3 rows in K1, P1 rib (= 2,5cm), increasing 1 stitch at centre of last row. There are 44 (48) sts. Then work as follows: 16 (18) sts in st st, 12 sts Cable, 16 (18) sts in st st. When work measures 53,5 (59,5)cm from beg, i.e. 76 (86) rows from border, for shoulders leave on a stitch holder the first and the last 11 (12) sts. For neck, cast off centre 22 (24) sts purlways on RS of work.

Sleeves: work top down, picking up sts across armhole. Before working sleeves, join shoulders. Place back shoulder sts on a needle and front shoulder sts on another needle and, with a third needle, cast off using the following technique: put the needles with RS towards each other. With third needle knit 1 st on each needle together, knit two more together and then slip 1st st over the next. Repeat knitting 2 tog and then cast off. Place a stitch-marker on either side of Back and Front, 17 (19)cm down shoulder seam, to mark beg and end of armholes. For each sleeve, with 7.50mm needles pick up 37 (41) sts across armhole and work in stocking st. When work measures approx 8 (10,5)cm from beg and 12 (16) rows have been worked, for cuff work 2 rows K1, P1 rib (= 2cm). Cast off all sts purlways on RS of work.

Sew side and sleeve seams.

Note: Wash garment carefully at low temperatures, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the garment to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging it.
